MASONIC PROPERTY REPORT

The Clinton Historical Society continued its efforts in the past few weeks towards its goal to acquire the Warren Masonic Lodge property in Schultzville. Progress to date includes:

- Letter of application...to the Masons formally requesting to be considered as future owners of the property. This letter to the Trustees outlines our intent to have the property restored, maintained, and used by the Clinton community.
- Meeting with the new town assessor to inform her of our intentions to apply for property tax exemption based on educational use. She will not be able to render an official position on this until we are owners of the property.
- 3. Townwide article appearing in the Clinton Watch newsletter as 'early awarness' to inform residents of our plans and goals, and to solicit their ideas and support for this project. We are pleased to report that the response has been very positive, and includes:
 - offers of professional landscape & electrician services, and non-professional labor
 - cash donations and pledges of additional financial support
 - ideas for use as a community center with a focus on how Clinton children might benefit
 - offers of commitments for the maintenance of the building, and staffing of exhibits and other events
