MASONIC HALL RESTORATION GROUP TO REPORT

On Monday Sept. 28, the Advisory Committee of the Historical Society will receive a status report from the group of residents who have spearheaded the drive to preserve the Masonic Hall in Schultzville and operate it for town benefit. To date, \$4,100 has been pledged or collected from the community towards the goal of \$5,000. Additionally, commitments of time and labor to restore and manage the building have been obtained from this "core" group of 16 residents and others in the community. At this meeting, the Advisory Committee may vote on the proposal to accept donation the property from the Warren Lodge Masons. What is needed is assurance that this major project will not jeapordize the Society's current efforts to preserve and maintain the 1777 Creek Meeting House and run the many programs that are in place and are planned for the future.

If a vote is taken and it is in favor of the proposal, the full Society membership will also receive the proposal and vote on it in a future meeting to be announced.
