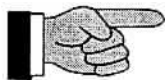

"SEARCH & RECOVERY: ANTIQUE ENGINES"

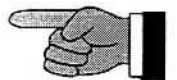
Jim Boice, President of the Century Museum, will give us an insider's look at how antique engines are discovered, rescued, and preserved for the enjoyment and education of the public. Jim is well-known in the area for his restorations of antique cars, trucks, and "hit-and-miss" engines, and this is a personal account of recent recovery operations. Jim heard about a very rare engine from the 1880's "out in a field on the side of a hill somewhere", and after some detective work, located the artifact. This engine is rare because it is powered by HOT AIR and is a monster in size. Jim and his Century friends used a lot of ingenuity to wrestle the huge engine from its precarious position, and the rescue provides a very interesting tale. Jim's slide presentation will cover all the intriguing aspects of the recovery "in full color." Jim will also relate other search and recovery missions that have added to the impressive collection of the Century Museum housed in their special building on the D.C. Fairgrounds property.
