GEORGE GREENWOOD RECEIVES PRESERVATION AWARD

A highlight of the Society's Annual Meeting April 7 occurred with the presentation of our Preservation Award to long-time member George Greenwood.

The award recognizes exceptional contribution in the preservation of area history, artifacts, and structures for the benefit of residents and future generations. George has co-directed with Town Historian and Past President Bill McDermott four major local railroad history exhibits held at our Historical Center in Clinton Corners. George and Bill worked together again last year with other members to preserve and display a valued collection of turn-of-the-century glass plate negative photos that was very well attended. These exhibits have preserved important artifacts and information that relate to Clinton and nearby areas. As Society director of exhibits, George is developing this year's major show featuring the Dutchess County Sports Hall of Fame. George has served as Society Trustee for several years during a period of significant growth that he has helped to guide.

George is also co-town historian of Pleasant Valley, and has served as President of that town's historical society. He is actively engaged with that group seeking to restore the mill site building for community benefit.

In presenting the award to George, President Craig Marshall expressed the Society's gratitude for George's dedication, talent, and valued counsel in helping set future directions for the group. With his wife Ruth and other family members in attendance, George accepted the award with thanks especially to those who also helped to make the exhibits a success.
